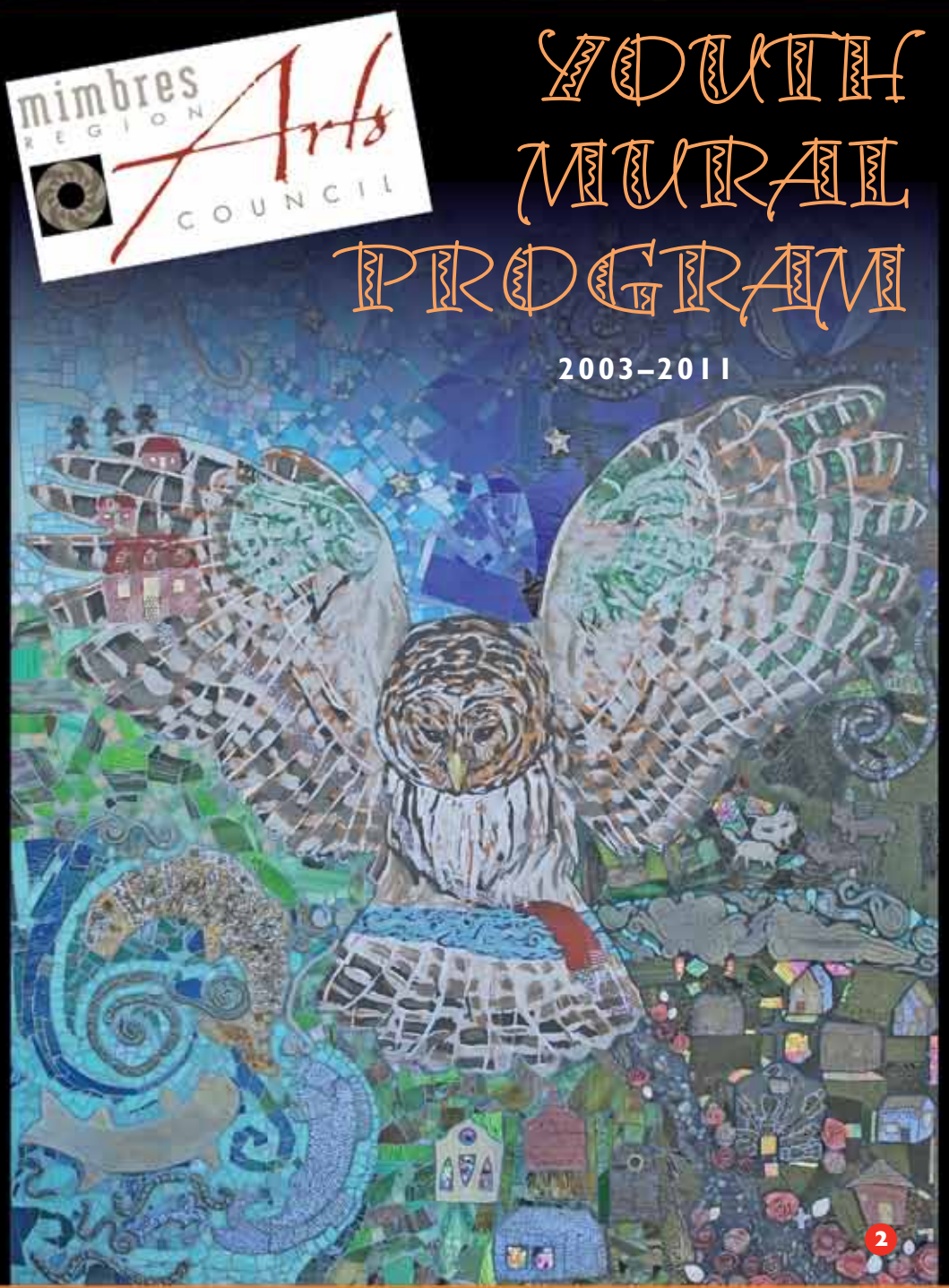


HERNANDEZ MURAL PROGRAM

1. Silver City Skate Park-2010, Title: Dome Skull

Artists Beth Menzger, Buck Burns, and Krystina Romero and high school interns worked with 13 campers ages 5-12 years old to create a mural inspired by local skateboarders and bike riders. Site sponsor: GIFTT (Gila Institute for Tots to Teens) and Manzanita Ridge.

2. Silver City Public Library-2009, Title: Bless Me Ultima

Artists Beth Menzger and Diana Ingalls Leyba worked with Aldo Leopold High School students to create this tile mosaic and painted mural based on the novel of the same name by Rudolfo Anaya. Site Sponsor: Friends of the Library, the NEA Big Read Project, Library Foundation Board

3. LifeQuest-2007, Title: Dream Mandala

Artists Zoe Wolfe and Sue Sherman worked with Life Quest clients and Aldo Leopold High School students to produce autobiographical scenes depicting southwest animals and plant forms. Site Sponsor: LifeQuest

4. Morning Star-2006, Title: Southwest Welcome

Artist M. Fred Barraza worked with high school students to create this mural incorporating a typical desert lizard and the traditional New Mexico Zia symbol. Site Sponsor: Morning Star

5. The Hub #2-2010, Title: Transportation in the 30's, 40's and 50's

Students from Sarah Pineda's Cobre High School clay class worked with artists, Kate Brown and project intern Krystina Romero, to produce a mural commemorating the Clifton Motors Chevy dealership, which used to occupy the site. Site sponsor: Janey Katz & Suzi Calhoun

6. The Hub #1-2007, Title: Ft. Bayard History

Artists Carlene Roers and Diana Ingalls Leyba worked with Fran Morrison's 6th and 7th grade students at La Plata Middle School, who painted scenes on strips of mural cloth depicting the history of old Fort Bayard, from the Buffalo soldiers and the Nazi prisoners of war to the nurses who cared for TB patients. 8. Heritage Window #1-2005, Title: Apache Heritage

Pineda and her Cobre High School art students to create this multi-media mural commemorating the areas Mimbreno history.

Heritage Window #3-2009, Title: Hispanic Heritage

Artists Diana Ingalls Leyba and Cecilia Stanford worked with Silver High School students to create this multi-media mural commemorating the areas Hispanic history.

Heritage Window #4-2006, Title: Anglo Heritage

Levi's Cliff High School students to create this multi-media mural commemorating the areas Anglo history.

Heritage Window #5-2008, Title: Multi-cultural Heritage

Artists Diana Ingalls Leyba and Cecilia Stanford worked with Sarah Pineda's Cobre High School art students to create this multi-media mural commemorating the areas varied populations.

9. Yankie and Bullard St.-2008, Title: Gila River Flow

Artists Zoe Wolfe and Melanie Zipin worked with high school interns and students ages 5-12 to create images depicting the flora and fauna of the Gila River. Site Sponsor: Gila River Festival

10. Downtown Tile Project #1-2008, Title: Ranching and Nature

20. Viola Stone Park-2007, Title: Santa Clara Childhood

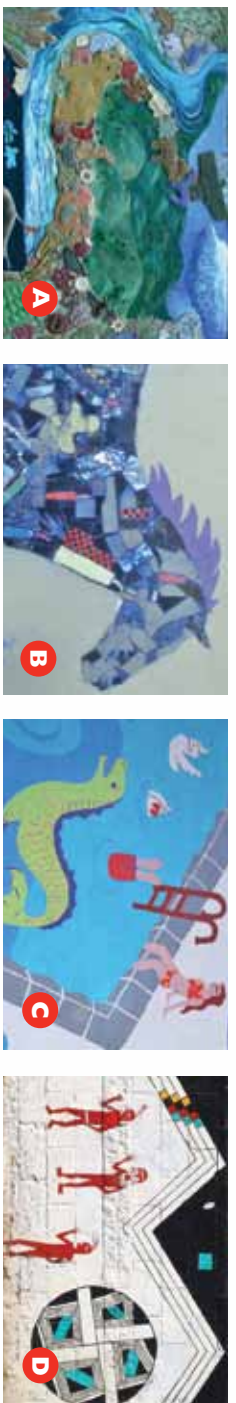
